The date of the 15th International Corrosion Congress in the historical city of Granada is approaching fast and our Spanish colleagues are busy working on the scientific program of the Congress. 5. Marcel Pourbaix Award

The Marcel Pourbaix award recognizes unselfish contributions to international collaboration in the field of corrosion. According to the terms of reference the award winner should have made "an exceptional contribution in promoting the objectives stated in the ICC constitution, in stimulating activity on an international level and in developing cooperation, friendship and support". Recent recipients of the award were R. Hussey and Prof. E. Mattson. The next award will be given at the 15th International Corrosion Congress in Granada. No restrictions as to membership in ICC or in other societies apply in order to qualify for the Marcel Pourbaix Award. *Please send nominations for the Marcel Pourbaix Award in triplicate to me at the above address. The deadline for receiving applications is February 15, 2002*.

6. Young ResearcherTravel Award

Thanks to a generous donation the ICC is now in a position to offer a travel award to a young researcher who presents a paper at the next International Corrosion Congress. The award winner will be selected by a Jury, which takes into account the quality of the proposed contribution and the financial situation of the applicants. Preference will generally be given to applicants from developing countries. The award consists of a

maximum of 1000 Euro. The <u>detailed rules</u> for the travel award will be posted on the ICC WEB site.

Please draw the existence of this award to the attention of promising young researchers in your country! Deadline for receiving applications is November 15, 2001.

7. Election of Vice Chairman

At present the Executive Committee of ICC includes M. Graham (Immediate Past Chairman), D. Landolt (Chairman), H. DeWit (First Vice Chairman), A. Pourbaix (Second Vice Chairman) and P. Schmuki (Secretary). For the next three-year term starting after the Granada congress two Vice Chairmen must be elected. The Nominating Committee consisting of Profs. Ives, Gouda and Shibata has proposed the following slate of three candidates for two positions of Vice Chairman:

A. Pourbaix (2nd Vice Chairman, Belgium), T. Tsuru (Japan), D.J. Young (Australia). You find details on the election procedure in the bylaws published on the WEB site. According to these bylaws ICC members can propose additional candidates if they desire. If you want to make additional nominations I must receive them before the deadline of February 15, 2002.
